In an ever-evolving world, I believe the role of education is more crucial than ever. It is not just about memorizing facts and figures; it's about equipping students with the skills they need to navigate the complexities of modern times. One such skill that deserves even more attention today is critical thinking. The importance of critical thinking in modern education and how it empowers students to become lifelong learners and informed citizens, cannot be underestimated. In a world where information is abundant and rapidly changing, critical thinking is the compass that can guide students through the complexities they will encounter. By emphasizing the importance of critical thinking in education, we not only prepare students for the challenges of today but also equip them with the skills to thrive in the future. Hartsburg-Emden CUSD #21 continues to push students to think critically and objectively about information they are given.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) has emerged as a powerful force that is reshaping society (and education) in countless ways. From improving everyday conveniences to addressing complex global challenges, AI is influencing society in ways that were only once imagined in science fiction books or movies. AI is a transformative force that is remaking various arenas, offering opportunities for innovation, economic growth, and improved quality of life. However, it also presents ethical challenges that require careful consideration. As with many of our technological advances (Internet and Social Media), there is good use and there is bad use. The debate between good and bad (appropriate and inappropriate) centers on the question of whether AI is being used to assist or manipulate, inform or misinform, educate or indoctrinate, etc. It is a complex and ongoing philosophical discussion with implications for ethical, legal, and religious complexities of our world. Having these discussions with our students, and encouraging them to use critical thinking skills, needs to be applied to AI as well. Having students fall prey to misinformation needs to be avoided. We need to emphasize critical thinking skills in all areas. Encourage students to ask questions, evaluate evidence, and consider alternative perspectives. By incorporating strategies

into the education system, we can help our students develop the critical thinking and media literacy skills necessary to navigate the information landscape responsibly and resist falling prey to the misinformation or misuse.

Now let's talk about the growth mindset. If one has this perspective, he/she tends to see levels of intelligence, skill, talent, and success. He/She believes in a starting point and grows from there. There are numerous stepping stones toward development and improvement. This growth mindset is founded on the belief that one can grow with dedication, hard work, time, and a commitment to getting better, smarter, and more talented about whatever he/she chooses. If you have a growth mindset, you believe you can increase your knowledge, creativity, or athletic ability. A growth mindset person doesn't let challenge or failure stop him/her from performing the task, especially if he/she enjoys it. One looks to learn from their mistakes or failures and seeks improvement. It is so important in education that we show students a growth mindset and avoid the pitfalls of a fixed mindset. A fixed mindset often leads students down a path to believe they do not have an certain ability to do certain things because they are just no good at it. One will often avoid those things and really stifle their ability to grow in these particular areas. A belief that each and every student is truly able to reach their full potential, a growth mindset is essential to accomplish that goal. At Hartsburg-Emden, we want our students to grow holistically. We want to improve on things they struggle with and to strengthen the things they thrive.

In conclusion, I'd like to say that we have many exciting activities going on in our buildings. We continually work on developing positive relationships with our students. We stress to our students the concepts of continual growth, critical thinking, and maintaining a positive outlook. I enjoy getting into the classrooms and attending school events in the evening to watch our students grow and develop. I encourage each of you (our community) to take full advantage of all the activities we have to offer. As always, I appreciate the support you give our district, staff, and especially our students. 




