#### FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

One of the most important steps someone can take toward achieving their greatest potential in life is to learn to monitor their attitude and its impact on their work performance, relationships and everyone around them. Why is attitude important? When we begin talking about attitude, often this brings puzzled looks to people's faces. In truth, people generally don't have a high level of attitude awareness. People know if they are hungry or if their feet hurt, but they usually don't have a good handle on their attitude, especially children. Teachers often say to students "attitude is everything". Attitude governs the way students perceive the world and the way the world perceives them. We all have a choice. We can choose an inner dialogue of self-encouragement and selfmotivation, or we can choose one of self-defeat and self-pity. It's a power we all have. Each of us encounters hard times, hurt feelings, heartache, and failure. The key is to realize it's not what happens to you that matters; it's how you choose to respond that gives you back control.

Bouncing back from failure turns out to be one of the best lessons a kid can learn. In fact, according to Angela Duckworth, Ph.D., a psychologist at the University of Pennsylvania, that skill (along with certain other character traits like grit and determination) matters more to a child's ability to reach his/her full potential than intelligence or grades. "The idea that kids have to get straight A's in everything and to take advanced classes is misguided," says Duckworth. Duckworth has been studying the role character plays in success since 2005. She's followed adults, West Point cadets, National Spelling Bee champions, and students at elite universities. In every case, she found that bouncing back from failure, grit, and determination were the most reliable predictor of a positive outcome. She found that the child who won the spelling bee wasn't necessarily smarter than their peers; he/she just worked a whole lot harder at studying words. Unlike IQ, which is relatively fixed, grit is something everyone can develop. Sure, some kids are naturally more gritty than others, but there's plenty you can do to help a child develop the stick-to-itiveness that will help each child succeed in whatever he/she wants to pursue.

Michael Jordan is widely considered to be the greatest basketball player of all time. In fact, he's arguably one of the greatest athletes of all time. He was a four-time gold medalist with USA Basketball, including winning two Olympic Gold Medals, and was twice named the USA Basketball Male Athlete of the Year. For more than a decade, he was the face of the NBA. Michael Jordan is a great example for success coming to someone after much invested time and effort ('hard work') and after experiencing failure. Michael Jordan often encourages young individuals by telling them to never fear failure, fear not trying, fear not giving your best, fear losing focus, but never fear failure itself. Failure is the path to success. Failure is the sign that you're headed in the right direction. To succeed twice as fast, work twice as hard, and maybe fail twice as much. Michael Jordan said, "I've never been afraid to fail." Failure means you haven't succeeded . . . yet!

Over the past five years, we've seen a lot of different things in public education, the new Common Core standards, PERA (Performance Evaluation Reform *Act – new teacher evaluation tool*), challenges to close the achievement gap, and continual funding issues. Hartsburg-Emden school district has addressed these important factors with grit – while working hard to re-establishing school pride and positive attitudes. Unless we are not afraid of failure, our students won't be either. Work Hard/Play Hard hasn't been just an important message we are trying to send to our students, it is something the staff is trying to model. We need to remind ourselves of that each day. We are here to help each child reach their fullest potential. Grit, failure, determination, and positive attitude are all important pieces to the puzzle.

Students will be tested on their proficiency in Reading and Mathematics. I ask you to encourage your child(ren) to take full

advantage of this opportunity to demonstrate all they have learned. We want all of our students to do their best! This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> year for this exam and it will be taken as an online format and is very interactive. I am anxious to see how our students perform this year. I encourage all parents to talk to their child(ren) and encourage them through this process. It can be a stressful time for them. On test days, make sure they get a good night sleep and a healthy breakfast. The teachers have spent a lot of time preparing them for the test this year and really want them to do their best. The teachers have a lot of confidence in our students and are hoping for positive results. As opposed to last year which had two separate testing windows (one in March and one in May) this year's PARCC test will only be the one session which is starting April 4<sup>th</sup> and lasting 2-3 weeks.

February was a very busy month here at Hartem. Our Junior High School Basketball Teams finished their seasons in the regional. I would like to thank and congratulate Coach Rademaker, Coach Briggs, Coach Langley, Coach Benner, all of the basketball players, and all of the cheerleaders for a great season. Congratulations to Alyssa Bridge on completing her final season as our lone competitor in girls' basketball. Our Jr. High Volleyball team will be beginning the State Series soon. Good luck to them in the post season. Our High School Scholastic Bowl Team has been competing on Thursdays this past month. They will be starting their post season soon, and Jr. High Scholastic Bowl will be in full swing very soon. Good luck to our High School Basketball Team that will be entering the post season the last week of February. Our WYSE team and Science Olympiad Teams competed and we had several students medal and place. Congratulations!!! The FFA added even more excitement to our month of February by celebrating National FFA week the last week of February. Finally, I would like to thank Mr. Pluhm and our Pep Band. ### WYSE

This is the third year Hartsburg-Emden High School has participated in the Worldwide Youth in Science and Engineering Academic Challenge, a competition that tests students in Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, English, Engineering Graphics, and Computer Programming. This year we had a team of 12 students, which is impressive considering our small size. Our division for the competition consisted of schools with a high school enrollment of 300 or less, and while we placed 7th out of 9 as a team, we also outscored two schools in the 700 division and one in the 1500 division.

Though our overall score was not high enough to advance to the State competition as a team, we did have two students who medaled in their tests. Dylan Duvall, 9th grade, placed 3rd in the Computer Programming category, and Sierra Smith, 9th grade, placed 2nd in Physics. Sierra will be advancing to the State competition as an individual on March 8th. Congratulations!

This year, our regional competition fell during Homecoming Week's Character/Celebrity Day, and I was happy to see that several of our team members dressed up!



### JH SCHOLASTIC BOWL

The Junior High Scholastic Bowl team is off to a strong start! Our A team defeated Zion Lutheran in our first match of the year, 190-165. This is one of our tougher competitors, and it was a great way to get our season rolling!

#### SCIENCE OLYMPIAD

This year was the first year Hartsburg-Emden participated in Science Olympiad, a collection of competitive events designed for middle school and high school students. There are test-based events, like Fossils or Green Generation, and others where students need to build an apparatus in advance, like Robot Arm or Bridge Building. Science Olympiad gives students an opportunity to extend their knowledge and application of STEM fields beyond the school day.

Our team did remarkably well for their first year! Our team consisted of 10 students, while most other schools brought the maximum of 15 students. Science Olympiad does not divide schools up by size; one of the nine teams we competed against has an enrollment of 2,000 students. We only entered 10 of the 21 possible events. Even so, we placed 7th overall, and missed 6th place by one point! Additionally, our team was made up of four 8th graders, five 9th graders, and one senior, so we had a very young team. I am very excited for next year!

We had several teams medal, which I was not expecting. Most of the schools we played against have very well-established Science Olympiad teams. One of the downsides of Science Olympiad is that the regional is the first competition, and if you don't advance to State, it's the only competition of the year. Our students were experiencing their events for the very first time. Even so, Seth Evans placed 4th in Game On, an event where he had to create a computer game on a given science topic in 50 minutes. Dylan Duvall and Wyatt Conrady placed 4th with their bridge in Bridge Building, and Dylan Duvall and Austin Hayes placed 2nd for their wind turbine in Wind Power.

I told the team that our goal for this year was to have fun. Mission accomplished!


