NEWSLETTER/POSTAL SERVICE

It has recently been brought to Hartsburg-Emden School District's attention that the Postal Service will no longer allow us to do mass mailings. Evidently that has been the US Postal Services new policy for a few years. School Districts are no longer on the list of entities that are allowed to do mailings to all 'Box Holders' in a mailing district (Hartsburg/Emden in our case). This mailing will be the last one we will be allowed to do this way.

The post office is requiring us to have specific address each newsletter. In order to do this, we'd have to purchase, from a mailing company, all addresses within the area we want to mail. We'd also have to likely pay a maintenance fee to keep the list updated. In order to keep mailing to all Box Holders, we would need to print mailing labels and apply them to each newsletter. All newsletters would have to go to Springfield, IL to be processed, then sent back to Hartsburg and Emden for distribution. The local post office can no longer put them directly into your mailboxes. The increase in cost and time for this process will be substantial. The Post Office is getting us a quote for that cost. We are also in the process of determining how newsletters will be handled going forward. As soon as a decision is made, we'll let everyone know.

EYE, DENTAL, AND PHYSICAL EXAMS AND IMMUNIZATIONS

Physical exams are a STATE REQUIREMENT of all Kindergarten, 6th and 9th graders. Also, all Kindergarten, 6th and 9th graders are required to have their immunization records up to date. The Logan County Health Department offers the booster immunizations and lead screenings. Please call them for an appointment at 735-2317. The State of Illinois also requires that all children entering Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grades to have a dental examination. The examination must be completed between May 15, 2018 and May 15, 2019. Proof of examination is due no later than May 15, 2019. All Kindergarten students and any student new to an Illinois school will be required to have a vision screening. The examination must be completed within the past 12 months. Proof of examination is due no later than October 15, 2018.

Students participating in sports and cheerleading must have a physical on file in the office before their sport's program begins. A sports physical is good for one calendar year. If you have any questions, please call Erika at the high school 642-5244.
