GIRLS ON THE RUN

What is Girls on the Run (GOTR)?

Girls on the Run is a fun and effective afterschool program designed to enhance girls' social, emotional and physical skills and behaviors to successfully navigate life experiences. Twice per week for 10 weeks, trained coaches lead small teams of 3rd – 5th grade girls through life skills lessons that incorporate running and other physical activities. The 20-lesson Girls on the Run curriculum combines training for a 5k (3.1 miles) running event with lessons that inspire girls to become independent thinkers, enhance their problem solving skills and make healthy decisions. All of this is accomplished through an active collaboration with girls and their parents, schools, volunteers, staff, and the community. Meeting twice a week in small teams of 8-15 girls, we teach life skills through dynamic, conversation-based lessons and running games.

The 20-lesson curriculum is taught by certified Girls on the Run coaches and includes three parts: understanding ourselves, valuing relationships and teamwork and understanding how we connect with and shape the world at large. Running is used to inspire and motivate girls, encourage lifelong health and fitness, and build confidence through accomplishment. At each season's conclusion, the girls and their running buddies, complete a 5k running event. Completing a 5k gives the girls a tangible sense of achievement as well as a framework for setting and achieving life goals. The result—making the seemingly impossible, possible and teaching girls that they can.

We had a great season last fall and we are excited to begin another season in Fall 2019! Here are some things our GOTR members said about what they learned from being a GOTR last fall:

- We all make a difference
- How to work together
- Making friends and keeping friends
- That getting exercise is important
- Star Power!
- How not to yell when you are mad
- How to take a deep breath
- I feel... When you... Because... I would like for you to... (Using "I" messages to express feelings)
- Helping others
- Building self-confidence and being kind
- Helping people is better than not helping people

If you have a girl that will be in $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ grade this year, we hope that you will consider registering for GOTR. Registration for GOTR will begin August 14^{th} at 9:00 am! The Fall 2019 season will begin on September 3^{rd} at Emden Elementary School. We will meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30 pm – 4:45pm, Sept 3 – Nov 12th. GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT

Before you know it, it will be August 19th and students will be back in school. The beginning of the school year brings out a great deal of anxiety for many students. Our students experience so many different transitions. They might be making the big jump from kindergarten to first grade, or from fifth grade to the middle school. Students might just be transitioning from one grade to the next, or even moving around the block to a new house or apartment. No matter what the transition, we want to make it as smooth as possible so that each child has a successful school experience. Here are some tips to try to ease the anxieties that come along with some transitions:

- Focus On The Positives: new friends, new teachers, and new opportunities
- Make a list. If your student if feeling anxious about moving up, create a two-sided list with your child. On one side you can include things your child is looking forward to. On the other, brainstorm things he or she may be anxious about. These lists can start a good conversation, and possibly even give your child a chance to reflect on past challenges he or she has overcome.
- Begin preparations early. Help your child phase in adjustments ahead of time. For example, at the end of a school vacation, start setting bedtime routines earlier to help prepare for the transition back to school.

Inform the school. Consider any situations or special circumstances that might make it more difficult for your child to transition. Don't forget, the school staff want to help make next year great!

Activity Fee: A participation fee per student is required for the following high school activities: basketball, baseball, volleyball, softball, golf, *swimming*, scholastic bowl, cheerleading, track, cross country and bass fishing. A participation fee per student is required for the following junior high activities: basketball, baseball, volleyball, softball, scholastic bowl, cheerleading and track. The fee is \$25 per activity, not to exceed \$50. <u>All registration</u> <u>and activity fees must be paid before any student</u> <u>participates in any extra-curricular activity.</u> In the case of a co-op activity, students will pay the host school activity fee, discounts do not apply.

Band Fee: An instrument rental fee is \$25 per year. This fee will need to be paid on band rental day.

TITLE I FUNDS

EYE, DENTAL, AND PHYSICAL EXAMS AND Immunizations

Physical exams are a STATE REQUIREMENT of all Kindergarten, 6th and 9th graders. Also, all Kindergarten, 6th and 9th graders are required to have their immunization records up to date. The Logan County Health Department offers the booster immunizations and lead screenings. Please call them for an appointment at 735-2317. The State of Illinois also requires that all children entering Kindergarten, 2nd, and 6th grades to have a dental examination. The examination must be completed between May 15, 2019 and May 15, 2020. Proof of examination is due no later than May 15, 2020.

All Kindergarten students and any student new to an Illinois school will be required to have a vision screening. The examination must be completed within the past 12 months. Proof of examination is due no later than October 15, 2019.

Students participating in sports and cheerleading must have a physical on file in the office before their sport's program begins. A sports physical is good for one calendar year. Please remember that junior high softball starts in July and junior high baseball and high school golf and volleyball start at the beginning of August and physicals need to be on file **BEFORE** they may practice or tryout.
