EYE, DENTAL, AND PHYSICAL EXAMS AND

IMMUNIZATIONS

Physical exams are a STATE REQUIREMENT of all Kindergarten, 6th and 9th graders. Also, all Kindergarten, 6th and 9th graders are required to have their immunization records up to date. The Logan County

Health Department offers the booster immunizations and lead screenings. Please call them for an appointment at 735-2317.

The State of Illinois also requires that all children entering Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grades to have a dental examination. The examination must be completed between May 15, 2016 and May 15, 2017. Proof of examination is due no later than May 15, 2017.

All Kindergarten students and any student new to an Illinois school will be required to have a vision screening. The examination must be completed within the past 12 months. Proof of examination is due no later than October 15, 2016.

Students participating in sports and cheerleading must have a physical on file in the office before the tryouts or their sport's program begins. A sport's physical is good for one calendar year. Please remember that junior high softball starts in July and junior high baseball and high school golf and volleyball start at the beginning of August and the physicals need to be on file BEFORE they may practice or tryout.


8TH GRADE FIELD TRIP

The 8th grade class visited the Illinois Holocaust Museum in Skokie, Illinois on May 17th. Students have been learning about WW II in social studies and reading about the Holocaust in reading class. Students had the amazing opportunity to hear a Holocaust Survivor tell her story. Sura Vaysman was born in Moldavia in 1933 and had one older brother. Her husband, Matvey Vaysman, was also from Moldavia. He was born in 1935 and was one of six children. When the Nazis invaded, both families were constantly on the move trying to avoid Nazi occupation, spending much of their time hiding in forests. Sura and Matvey moved to Chicago in 1989 with their two children. Sura knitted two red, white and blue scarves to give to students. Two Hartem students, Spencer Davis and Wyatt Hopkins, received the scarves as gifts from Sura.

Students then traveled to Wrigley Field for a tour. We learned about the history of the "Friendly Confines". We toured the press box and the visiting team club house...where Babe Ruth once got ready for baseball games! Students were then able to go on to the field and sit in the dugout.
