FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

Students across the state, as well as those here at Hartsburg-Emden CUSD #21, have been busy preparing for the State assessments over the last few weeks. In addition to the local formative assessment we use to make instructional decisions (AIMSWeb), districts are also required to administer the PARCC Exam again. However, the State made several modifications to this years' test. We are required to have only 1 test session (instead of 2), so overall a lesser time commitment for testing and lesser loss in time for daily instruction. This marks the 5th straight year the State has changed the State testing format or its benchmarking levels. Regardless how the State continues to matriculate (or tweak) the exam, we have focused on improving instruction to do what's best for students. We ask our students to do their best at everything: Basketball, Volleyball, Scholastic Bowl, and Testing. When compared to the State Average and Area Districts, Hartsburg-Emden has made some nice gains over the last 3 years. We want to continue that trend. Please encourage your son/daughter to show what they know on the test. Stress the importance of learning and doing their best on everything. The staff at Hartsburg Emden always appreciates the support we get from our parents. Thank you!

Hartsburg-Emden CUSD #21 values providing the highest-quality education for our students, while maintaining financial stability. We value our partnership between parents, staff, School Board, and the Hartem Community Club in supporting the aspirations of every child we serve. So, our school budget is more than just a spreadsheet, but a very real resource that translates into excellent teachers and licensed paraprofessionals, quality curriculum and instruction materials, essential technology, clean facilities, fully-equipped buildings, safe and secure classrooms, bussing, food services, and so much more. A school budget is not limited to the specific school year dates. Rather, planning for the next school year budget is beginning now, while we are in the middle of teaching and learning this school year. Much depends on a variety of external factors, including anticipated funding from the State. It is hard to fathom that the State of Illinois does not yet have a budget for this year while we are closing out the school year and looking at maintaining the value

of education for next school year. We need to continue to pay very close attention to what is happening in Springfield as we begin to plan for the 2016-2017 School Year. We are hearing the State may run out of money in April and not be able to make its last few payments to General State Aid (GSA) to school districts for this year. As well as, holding up GSA payments for K-12 districts, at the beginning of next school year, if the entire budget isn't settled. There are talks that State funding may be held up until after the November elections, to see if support shifts one way or the other. Many school districts in Illinois, reliant on State funding, are grappling with how to plan for this uncertainty. Rather than focus on this uncertainty, Hartsburg-Emden School District, is actively employing best practices in order to begin the next school year on solid ground, with a full grasp and understanding of these external issues that may affect our budget. We hope the politicians will make the right decisions for our State and kids. In the meantime, as a district, I can assure you that we will always do what is best of for our students.

DISTRICT LUNCH POLICY

Once your child has \$20 in charges he/she will not be allowed to receive seconds or any extras. Also, once your child has \$40 in charges he/she will not be allowed to receive a school breakfast/lunch. They will be offered a peanut butter sandwich and a milk if they do not bring their own lunch. Students will not be allowed to acquire more than a \$40 deficit.

It's that time of year again... All Illinois schools have begun PARCC testing. PARCC testing at Hartem will begin April 4th and should be completed by the end of the month. State tests are important for your student's success. Because of this, testing can be very stressful. Here are some ways you can help minimize stress and maximize their performance throughout the testing process:

- DO make sure your child completes
 homework assignments and class projects.
 Because tests reflect overall achievement, the
 more effort your child puts into learning, the
 more likely he/she will do well on tests.
- DO make sure your child gets a good night's sleep, eats a healthy breakfast, and gets to school on time on the morning of the test.
- DO encourage your child to think positive thoughts about their performance on the test. For example, "I am going to ace this test!"
- DO support your child. Praise him/her for what he/she does well. When students feel good about themselves, they will do their best.

ACT/SAT

College-Bound Juniors: There is one more testing session in the 2015-2016 schoolyear for the ACT on June 11th, 2016. The registration deadline (without a late fee) is May 6th, 2016. There are locations in Bloomington and Normal offering the ACT on this date. Visit actstudent.org to register, view specific testing locations, and find test preparation materials. Heartland Community College offers an "Enhanced ACT Review" course at the Normal campus. The cost of this course is \$90 and twice a week on evenings from 5/3/16 - 5/19/16.
