FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

Students across the State, as well as those here at Hartsburg-Emden CUSD #21, have been busy preparing and taking the State assessments over the last several weeks. In addition to the local formative assessment we use to make instructional decisions (AIMSWeb Plus), districts are also required to administer the IAR (Illinois Assessment of Readiness) Exam again. This year is one of the rare times they have not made changes in the previous years' test. In my career at Hartem, went from ISAT to several years with PARCC, which had changes most of those years. Now we've been with the IAR which has also had changes in the majority of the years we have been administering it. I am personally not opposed to changes in the assessment, if there is a valid reason for them. In my opinion, the modifications of Illinois Standards and continued professional development go much further to improve our educational system than the modifications of an exam. It just seems to me, that it would be more worth our energy and resources to focus on the items that have the largest impact on improved education. Regardless, all grade levels will continue to take the same exams they took last year, including the science exam for grades 5 and 8. The preliminary results should come in over the summer with official results coming in October, over a half year later. In the meantime, Hartsburg-Emden CUSD #21 will stayed focused on improving instruction to do what's best for students. We ask our students to do their best at everything: Basketball, Volleyball, Scholastic Bowl, Testing, etc. We ask our parents and caregivers to please encourage your son/daughter to show what they know, not just on the test, but each and every day. Stress the importance of learning and doing their best on everything. The staff at Hartsburg Emden always appreciates the support we get from our parents. Thank you!

Hartsburg-Emden CUSD #21 values providing the highest-quality education for our students, while maintaining financial stability. We value our partnership between parents, staff, School Board, and the community in supporting the aspirations of every child we serve. So, our school budget is more than just a spreadsheet, but a very real resource that translates into excellent teachers and licensed paraprofessionals, quality curriculum and instruction

materials, essential technology, clean facilities, fully-equipped buildings, safe and secure classrooms, bussing, food services, and so much more. A school budget is not limited to the specific school year dates. Rather, planning for the next school year budget is beginning now, while we are in the middle of teaching and learning this school year. Much depends on a variety of external factors, including anticipated funding from the State. Next year school districts will no longer receive any ARP (America Rescue Plan) funds, which mostly came to us through ESSER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief) Grants. Many school districts in Illinois will be grappling with how to adjust for the loss of these revenues. Rather than focus on this uncertainty, Hartsburg-Emden School District, employed sound principals in using these funds fully anticipating these funds would go away and looked to avert any major issues for our future budgets. In 2012, my second year at Hartem, we started the year with 3.05% of expenditures left as a fund balance for our Education Fund. Next year, we will have 109.10% of expenditures left as a fund balance for our Education Fund. That means we have over a full year of expenditures to work with in our Education Fund. In addition, for all the Funds (which there are 9 specific funds for specific use . . . the Education Fund is biggest . . . about two-thirds of all expenditures), we will have roughly 110% of all expenditures left as all fund balances for all our Funds (which was about 35% in 2012). In addition, we also managed to accomplish some much-needed upgrades on the Emden Elementary Playground and the High School Ag Shop. As a district, I believe we are in a good position moving forward.

In conclusion, I hope everyone has a great Spring. Spring seems to be nature's way of reminding us that even after the coldest and darkest days, warmth and growth are just around the corner. I hope the beauty of Spring inspires you with positivity, hope, and endless possibilities. Embracing the warmth of the sun, the scent of fresh flowers, and the joy of longer days, always fills me with optimism and hope for the future. Go Stags!!

FRESHMAN ORIENTATION
