The beginning of the school year brings out much anxiety for many students. Our students experience so many different transitions. They might be making the big jump from kindergarten to first grade or from fifth grade to middle school. Students might just be transitioning from one grade to the next or even moving around the block to a new house. No matter the transition, we want to make it as smooth as possible, so each child has a successful school experience.

Here are some tips to try to ease the anxieties that come along with some transitions:

Focus on the Positives: new friends, teachers, and opportunities.

- Make a list. If your student is anxious about moving up, create a two-sided list with your child. On one side, you can include things your child is looking forward to. On the other side, brainstorm things he or she may be anxious about. These lists can start a good conversation and possibly even give your child a chance to reflect on past challenges he or she has overcome.
- Begin preparations early. Help your child phase in adjustments ahead of time. For example, at the beginning of August, start setting bedtime routines earlier to help prepare for the transition back to school.
- Inform the school and consider any situations or special circumstances that might make it more difficult for your child to transition. Don't forget; the school staff wants to help make next year great!

## ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT

This is to inform all parents and staff of the status of our schools' asbestos management plan. As required, our buildings were initially inspected for asbestos. Our inspection was conducted on October 16, 1988. The AHERA law requires that a visual surveillance of asbestos containing areas be completed every six months, and a re-inspection conducted every three years.
