FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

It seems that the weather has turned very early this year. We had our 1st cold spell and snowfall well over a month before winter officially begins (December 21st). So, it is definitely time to get ready for the impending school-cancellations that our Central Illinois weather may bring us. We will always try to announce school closings with enough time for you to make arrangement to care for your kids, but it is always a good idea to think about some last-minute arrangements that would work for supervision. Again, we will try to make decisions with time to spare, including decisions on the previous evening of impending weather, but that will not always be possible. We will continue to monitor conditions as they change, so please be prepared for all-day cancellations and even early dismissals. No matter what the cancellation is, we will announce through the following media outlets: WJBC (1230AM), WBNQ (101.5 FM), B104 (104.1 FM), WJEZ (98.9 FM) (you may also visit the radio station's website), ABC Channel 20 (Springfield, Decatur, Champagne)

(https://newschannel20.com/weather/closings), NBC Channel 25 (Peoria, Bloomington, Normal) (https://week.com/closings-and-delays), as well as a school reach all-call.

Next, our school continues to look at the projects needed to maintain our facilities at both the Emden and Hartsburg schools. The Board and Maintenance Staff have done a great job identifying the priorities of work so we can continue operating a quality school that we are proud of. We added a new front door at the Elementary Building which will allow staff to enter off street level. We are receiving a tremendous donation which will allow us to put air conditioning in our gym at the Jr./Sr. High School at about 1/3 the cost. We are also looking for additional ways to make our buildings more secure as well as the possibility of adding some security cameras in needed areas. Student safety is a very important issue. We continue to train our staff on school safety and students social/emotional issues, but we can do some things to make our building physically more secure. However, we have an older building, which brings some challenges with this process.

Finally, I hope everyone enjoyed their Thanksgiving break and ate just enough turkey and stuffing. I seem to enjoy the holidays more each year. It helps when the Bears play on Thanksgiving Day and win. By the time you get this newsletter, we'll be getting close to the end of first semester which brings up the topic of semester exams. Semester exams are given in all classes and count as 1/7 of the student's final grade. This can be a stressful time for High School Students. Please encourage them to prepare and do their best in all they do. It will then be Christmas Break!! Then some time to relax. Every year Christmas seems to come faster and faster. If you have not been receiving School Reach messages throughout this school year, please contact the district office as soon as possible.



Beginning this November, students and teachers across Illinois will have an opportunity to participate in the seventh annual statewide Illinois 5Essentials Survey. This survey is designed to generate a detailed picture of the inner workings of your child's school. As a parent, this opportunity will allow you to share your thoughts on the important elements of school effectiveness in a survey about your child's school.

On behalf of the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois 5Essentials Survey will be administered online by UChicago Impact at the University of Chicago. The survey gathers data related to five indicators that can predict important student outcomes, including improved attendance and larger test score gains. These five indicators that affect and predict school success are:

- Effective Leaders
- Collaborative Teachers
- Involved Families
- Supportive Environments
- Ambitious Instruction

Prior research in more than 400 schools has shown that schools that were strong on at least three of these "5Essential" indicators were 10 times more likely to improve student learning gains in math and reading than those that were weak on three or more Essentials.

All teachers and 4th through 12th grade students will be responding to this survey. 5Essentials Reports will be generated for schools if their teachers and/or students meet the response rate threshold of 50 percent. These reports will be sent to schools and districts in March 2019 and will also be included in the State School Report Card.

Additionally, your district has chosen to provide the optional Parent Supplement survey. If at least 20 percent of Hartsburg-Emden parents complete this survey, a parent supplement report will also be generated. The parent data will not be reported on the State Report Card.

Your participation in the parent portion of the survey will help us understand the conditions at your child's school and guide improvement. Your identity and survey responses will be kept completely confidential and will never be connected to you or your child.

The Illinois 5Essentials Survey for students and teachers will be conducted through January 18, 2019. The Parent Survey Supplement will also be conducted through January 18, 2019. To take the survey please visit https://survey.5-essentials.org/Illinois/ and select the appropriate survey to begin.


VETERANS DAY THANK YOU

19-20 DUAL-CREDIT COURSES

Are you interested in taking college classes while still in high school? Dual credit is an opportunity for students in grades 11-12 to take classes in high school and one or more college level classes on an online university. Dual credit courses are a great opportunity to receive extra high school credit AND earn college credit towards Gen. Eds. The courses that will be offered next year are: **ENGLISH 101** (Critical Reading & Writing) and **ENGLISH 102** (Multimodal Composition).

Qualifications:

If you are interested in taking a Dual Credit course next year (AY 19-20), you <u>MUST</u> complete a Heartland application by <u>April 1</u> and ACCUPLACER Assessment (or submit a qualifying score) by <u>April 30</u> in order to be eligible to enroll in the course. Students can submit qualifying ACT or PSAT/SAT scores in place of the ACCUPLACER. See Mrs. Feltes for details.


