## FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

In October, I discussed the release of the PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) Exam for the State of Illinois. I went into detail about how the State has decided to add a fifth category called 'approaching expectations' category and arrange the benchmarks for each category with extremely high expectations. For students testing in the exceeds expectations category, the State averaged less than $4 \%$ of all students across grade levels. In Grade Schools (Grades 3-8), only an average of $33 \%$ of all students fell in the meets or exceeds expectations category. Now, when they say all students, that means all the students that tested. There were several exemptions made in which schools did not test or did not test certain grade levels. Therefore, Chicago Public Schools were able to score above the State average for the $1^{\text {st }}$ time in many years. So, it is my understanding that the State average may be a little higher than it would have been if all students actually tested. As far as the benchmarking or cutoff scores, it is a little concerning to me that the State would deliberately set the expectations this high. The ISAT test, for many years, told parents and schools that about 75\% of their students (in Grades 3-8) were meeting or exceeding expectations. In the last few years, the State changed the benchmarking to be close to $60 \%$ of students meeting or exceeding expectations. Now, under PARCC, it is at $33 \%$. However, if you consider the 'approaching expectations' category, the State average is $61 \%$ - which is close to where the ISAT was for the meets or exceeds expectations category. So, the new 'approaching expectations' category took almost half of the students out of the meets or exceeds category.

As an educator, I support high standards and high expectations. I also believe you have to show students the learning targets and test them on those learning targets shown. Basically, I believe in assessment of learning. It is also important to remember that each child has certain talents and abilities which contribute to success outside a single day standardized exam. Students also develop at different rates. We need to assist each student to reach their fullest potential. I am not convinced the PARCC Exam does an effective job measuring the new State Standards (the Common Core Standards)
or what is being taught in classroom. Which is one of the reasons, I believe, they are changing the PARCC Exam after this initial year of testing. Yes, they are modifying the State Exam again. I also don't agree with the setting of benchmarks so high that they are telling parents and schools that only one-third of their students are meeting or exceeding expectations and that two-thirds of their students are not. We are talking about 8-14 year old children in most cases.

With all that said, every year the State releases testing results through the School Report Card. The ISAT's were always released in October. Due to technical difficulty and other circumstances, the PARCC results were released in late November. Many of you know that over the last several years, we've been working hard to improve our results here at Hartsburg-Emden School District. It has been no secret that our scores were very poor three years ago - close to the bottom in the State and surrounding schools. So, how did we do? This year our Grades $3-8$ scored an overall average a $31 \%$ in the meets or exceeds category, $2 \%$ below the State average. If we add in the approaching expectations category, we were at $60 \%$ ( $1 \%$ below the State average) and we were $2 \%$ above the State in ELA (the Literacy portion of the exam). Half our classes in Grades 3-8 were above the State average. Again, I believe a State Average that is inflated this year, due to schools who opted out of taking the PARCC for various reasons this year. When compared other local schools (West Lincoln Broadwell, Chester East Lincoln, Lincoln District 27, Mt. Pulaski, Midwest Central, Illini Central, \& Delavan) in Grades 3-8 and in the meets \& exceeds categories, our student averages were $2^{\text {nd }}$ to Delavan. So, we did relatively well when compared to several local schools. Three years ago, we were outscored by all these schools. So, we've made some progress. I believe we still have work to do. I am always looking for ways to get better and improve - our work is never done. We always have children who need nurturing and we need to assist them to reach their fullest potential. However, Hartsburg-Emden has moved in the right direction over the last three years and the staff deserves a lot of credit for buying in to our new Authentic Literacy Program and working diligently with all our students. I also would like to thank the parents, your support and assistance with your child's education is always needed.

My first semester as the Superintendent of the Hartsburg-Emden School District is coming to a close and it has been an honor to serve in this capacity. All-in-all, it has been a good transition and I do enjoy the position. I'm not sure being anything but an educator was a choice for me. It is where my passion lies. I thank everyone (Students, Parents, Board Members and Staff) for making this semester a successful one. I would like to finish by wishing everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! I truly hope you enjoy the holidays. It is such a great time of the year. More people seem to be in great spirits. As each Christmas passes me, its meaning becomes deeper to me. The gifts I've been blessed with and the purpose of it all becomes much clearer. There are many times throughout the year I get busy and forget these things. It's nice to have a time of year to refocus and put things into perspective. I hope each and every one of you finds the joy in this season and are able to spend time with your families. Merry Christmas!!

Helping Others through Praise \& Encouragement
St. Peter's Lutheran Church Women of the Word after school program began its year October 13, 2015. H.O.P.E. meets Tuesdays after school from 3:15 to 5:00. 21 (Kindergarten $-4^{\text {th }}$ grade) children and 40 volunteers are participating this year. This program partners congregational and community members with individual children for reading and math practice. The volunteer listens to a child read in the sanctuary at their reading ability. For Math in Memorial Hall, the children are grouped working on Math fact games.

At snack time, the children have enjoyed decorating cookies with frosting \& sprinkles, dipping apples and pretzels in caramel, marshmallow fluff, and nutella, decorating cupcakes with sprinkles and flags, and eating monster dirt pie with critters. Also, the children enjoyed sorting and grouping items in their Thanksgiving Snack Mix that reminded them of our nation's abundance, our freedom from sacrifice of others, the love of family and friends, and memories of others that came before us.

In December, the children decorated their ice cream cups \& sugar cookies while they shared their favorite Christmas traditions and learned the candy cane story. Rudolph was also created and eaten! The kids enjoyed counting pretzel sticks and making shapes! While the children enjoy eating their snacks, Betty Gail reads a story each week. This year, she is sharing stories from "Jesus is Calling' Bible Storybook by Sarah Young. They gathered notebooks, rulers, scissors, pen and pencils, crayons, erasers, pencil sharpeners and placed items in a bag. The students enjoyed helping so other children around the world could have new school items like themselves. Some other projects, the HOPE students helped with were signing prayer cards and sending them to our veterans, and packing 12 shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. They are learning to spread God's love with children in need. Hidden pictures pages, dot to dot activities and magnet take home crafts are also worked on. During December, the children decorated Christmas cards for shut-ins and area nursing homes.

During music time, the children are learning the hymn "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus", "I'm in the Lord's Army" and "One Way- God said to get to Heaven". Other songs enjoyed have been "Father Abraham" and "God Bless America". The children close their session with HOPE by giving Praise to God, singing the Doxology.

Everyone at HOPE experiences an attitude of appreciation and gratitude for God's love and gifts as we build new friendships and help one another.
