While the recent weather is certainly reminding us that it is still summer, it is hard to believe that as I write this it is almost time to flip the school calendar to another Hartem School year. Hopefully everyone's summer activities are in full swing and you are finding some time for fun and relaxation with friends and family. The custodial and maintenance staffs have been working extremely hard to accomplish a multitude of tasks and projects this summer. Besides the annual cleaning of classrooms, scrubbing and waxing of floors, and cleaning, there is a long list of projects that our staff is tackling this summer.

Below are just a few of the items that we are working on to improve our facilities for next year.

<u>HS Gym Floor</u> - was over 25 years old and the varnish was starting to peel

<u>Baseball Shed</u> - was falling apart and Coach McAfee and some volunteers are building a new one <u>Replacing a couple of outdated restroom fixtures</u> <u>Replacing counter & sink in 5th Grade Room</u> <u>Painting hallways at both buildings</u> - we may touch the gym up if we have time

New Electrical Box on 2nd Floor - at Jr./Sr. High School (one of our last old fuse boxes) mostly breakers now

New Electrical lines run to Band Room for AC unit AC units installed in Band and 6th Grade rooms - all our classrooms in both buildings will now be air conditioned

<u>Liquid Tar on the Jr./Sr. High School roof</u>
<u>Grade School Library Floor</u> - the carpet has been removed and we returned back to the old hardwood floor

New Stage Curtains - Lori Lessen, Rachel Jordan, Calob Pluhm, and myself applied for a grant through the Woods Foundation (through the Woods and Bates Law Office in Lincoln, IL). The grant funded 50% of the costs. Another 25% of the cost was funded by the Hartsburg Methodist Church (who gave a very generous donation), St John's Lutheran Church Legacy Fund (Hartsburg), Immanuel Lutheran Church Legacy Fund (Lincoln), Jack Jordan, State Farm Insurance, Class of 2014, and Betty Gail Wagner. So, about 75% of the project is being donated and will be minimal cost to the district. We thank all those who made this project possible.

Also a few of our HLS (Health Life Safety) projects are being done. HLS projects – we are required by law to hire an architect every 10 years to inspect our buildings. Whatever the architect says we need to change/fix, we have to.

<u>Ag Shop Windows</u> – had broken glass <u>GS Tuck-pointing</u> – about 170 bricks needed to be replaced that were broken.

<u>Windows Repaired</u> – several balances in windows have broken and the windows weren't operable.

A huge thanks to all of the staff for their hard work during the summer to work through our long list of projects/improvements. This was our biggest summer with projects. The nice thing is that we have about 90% of our HLS projects completed.

As summer comes to an end, we are excited about the addition of new courses we will be offering our students: Computer Apps II (more Word, Excel, and PowerPoint), Sports and Entertainment Marketing, Physics, and Creative Writing. We are also adding an Enrichment/Gifted special at the Grade School. High School students also have an abundance of online options to fulfill a couple of their electives. As a staff, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our curriculum and instruction. We worked with Olivet Nazarene University (ONU) last year, who has a long tradition of providing quality education programs, for our Professional Development (PD). We will be continuing that relationship this year. A mixture of strategies for Differentiated Instruction and Writing in the Content Areas, as well as them proving some Coaching for our teachers is on the docket for this next school year. Our partnership with ONU has been a good one and has allowed some continuous growth as a staff. Our goal has been to get better each and every year. Another 'thank you' goes to the Hartem Teachers for their continued commitment to improving the quality of education we provide.

I hope everyone enjoys the last few weeks of the summer. We are looking forward to another great year here at Hartsburg-Emden. GO STAGS!!

EYE, DENTAL, AND PHYSICAL EXAMS AND **IMMUNIZATIONS**

Physical exams are a STATE REQUIREMENT of all Kindergarten, 6th and 9th graders. Also, all Kindergarten, 6th and 9th graders are required to have their immunization records up to date. The Logan County

Health Department offers the booster immunizations and lead screenings. Please call them for an appointment at 735-2317.

The State of Illinois also requires that all children entering Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grades to have a dental examination. The examination must be completed between May 15, 2017 and May 15, 2018. Proof of examination is due no later than May 15, 2018.

All Kindergarten students and any student new to an Illinois school will be required to have a vision screening. The examination must be completed within the past 12 months. Proof of examination is due no later than October 15, 2017.

Students participating in sports and cheerleading must have a physical on file in the office before the tryouts or their sport's program begins. A sport's physical is good for one calendar year. Please remember that junior high softball starts in July and junior high baseball and high school golf and volleyball start at the beginning of August and the physicals need to be on file **BEFORE** they may practice or tryout.

In the case of a co-op activity, students will pay the host school activity fee, discounts do not apply.
