FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

As many of you are aware, I strongly believe in continual growth/improvement. I talk about it often because it is at the core of my beliefs. It is my belief that perfection is something we strive to get closer to each day, week, month, and year. By the end of this school year, I am hopeful we'll have moved closer to excellence. I am also hopeful we will have moved our student's mindsets closer to that of continual growth/improvement. We all need to continue to work to be the best version of ourselves as possible. Too many people fall short of their full potential because they mistakenly fall into a fixed mindset (and that can be often difficult to change). Those with a fixed mindset limit themselves because they feel their potential is limited. Those with a continual growth mindset are always growing/improving throughout their lifetime. At Hartsburg-Emden we believe all our students have the ability to reach their goals and we want to do our best to ensure that happens.

One of the most important steps someone can take toward achieving their goals in life is to learn to monitor their mindset and its impact on performance, relationships and everyone around them. Why is having awareness about one's mindset so important? Teachers often say to students "attitude is everything". Attitude shows ones mindset, it governs the way students perceive the world and the way the world perceives them. Students who realize their mindset (or attitude) choose to respond to challenges or failure in a positive way. People with the fixed mindset look at failure as a quitting point, assuming they've reached their potential, which is often not the case. As educators, we need to challenge students and help guide them through failure. To me, there is nothing more frustrating than to see students 'give up' when faced with a challenge or failure. It truly is such a waste of (what I know to be) their abilities and potential. But as I said before, it is often difficult to convince them of that. So, we'll always do our best to keep pushing them.

Michael Jordan is widely considered to be the greatest basketball player of all time. In fact, he's arguably one of the greatest athletes of all time. He was a four-time gold medalist with USA Basketball, including winning two Olympic Gold Medals, and was twice named the USA Basketball Male Athlete of the Year. For more than a decade, he was the face of the NBA. Michael Jordan is a great example for success coming to someone after much invested time and effort ('hard work') and after experiencing failure. Michael Jordan often encourages young individuals by telling them to never fear failure, fear not trying, fear not giving your best, fear losing focus, but never fear failure itself. Failure is the path to success. Failure is the sign that you're headed in the right direction. To succeed twice as fast, work twice as hard, and maybe fail twice as much. Michael Jordan said, "I've never been afraid to fail." Failure means you haven't succeeded . . . vet!

Over my 24 years in the profession, I've seen a lot of different things happen to public education, the new Common Core standards, PERA (Performance *Evaluation Reform Act – new teacher evaluation* tool), multiple initiatives to close the achievement gap for minorities and special needs students, continual funding issues, the latest curriculum initiative (often passed down from legislatures - not educators), and many more items. Hartsburg-Emden school district has addressed these important factors and we'll continue to address them. However, I believe establishing students with a continual growth mindset and the ability to view failure as an opportunity (through hard work, grit, and a positive attitude) to achieve their goals – will always put students on the path to success. Work Hard/Play Hard hasn't been just an important message that I've tried to send to our students, it is something I've tried pushing onto the faculty at Hartem as well. We need to remind ourselves of that each day. We are here to help each child reach their fullest potential. Grit, determination, positive attitude, meeting challenges, learning from failures, and a continual growth mindset are all important pieces to the puzzle which leads to success. These things are what it means to be a Hartem Stag!!

I ask you to encourage your child(ren) to take full advantage of this opportunity to demonstrate all they have learned. We want all of our students to do their best! Our high school students in grades 9-11 will take part in either the PSAT or SAT during the month of April. Information will come home to families. Testing can be a stressful time for students. On test days, make sure they get a good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast. The teachers have spent a lot of time preparing them for the tests this year and really want them to do their best. The teachers have a lot of confidence in our students and are hoping for positive results.

February was a very busy month here at Hartem. Our Junior High School Basketball Teams and High School Basketball Teams finished their seasons in the regional. I would like to thank and congratulate our basketball and cheerleading coaches and all of the basketball players, and all of the cheerleaders for a great season. Amanda Feltes, K-12 Counselor It's hard to believe that we will be entering the 4th quarter this month! Where did the time go?! The spring is always a busy time of year in schools. Standardized testing begins soon and students will begin to decide what classes they will take in the next school year. Students should be checking with me to determine requirements towards graduation and assistance in choosing the most challenging and appropriate classes for the upcoming year. Additionally, seniors are reminded to check the counseling webpage weekly as many new scholarship applications continue to arrive! Don't miss out on an opportunity to gain some financial assistance for college. As always, if you have any questions regarding scheduling, grades, or graduation requirements, please see your counselor. Best of luck in this final stretch of the year! It's testing season! Testing for the Illinois Assessment of Readiness (formerly PARCC) will begin this month. Students in 3rd-8th grade will be participating in IAR testing. Additionally, students in 5th grade, 8th grade, and Botany will take the Illinois Science Assessment in early March. Students in 11th grade will be required to take the SAT on April 9th. This will be administered off-site again this year. Please keep an eye out for more information about the test day. New this year, Illinois has mandated that all students in 9th and 10th grade must take the PSAT on April 10th or 11th. Freshman will take the PAT 8/9 on April 10th and sophomores will take the PSAT 10 on April 11th. Students can prepare for the PSAT and/or SAT by accessing practice materials at

https://www.khanacademy.org/sat. If you have any questions about any of the mandatory standardized tests, please don't hesitate to reach out. State tests are important for your student's success. Because of this, testing can be very stressful. Here are some ways you can help minimize stress and maximize their performance throughout the testing process:

- DO make sure your child completes homework assignments and class projects. Because tests reflect overall achievement, the more effort your child puts into learning, the more likely he/she will do well on tests.
- DO make sure your child gets a good night's sleep, eats a healthy breakfast, and gets to school on time on the morning of the test.

- DO encourage your child to think positive thoughts about their performance on the test. For example, "I am going to ace this test!"
- DO support your child. Praise him/her for what he/she does well. When students feel good about themselves, they will do their best.
