## HARTSBURG-EMDEN CUSD NO. 21 MAY 2016 NEWSLETTER From the Superintendent's Desk

One year ago I used the May newsletter to introduce our new principal and put closure to the school year. I expressed how my time as Principal at Hartsburg-Emden CUSD # 21 had been enjoyable. I could echo similar sentiments today about being the Superintendent and they would be just as sincere but I would rather focus on State testing, which has recently become a hot topic again. Specifically, I'd like to talk about the Common Core and the PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) exam. I understand many individuals have an opinion about this topic and it can be a pretty sensitive issue.

Quick review, the new State Standards, also known as the Common Core Standards, have been in place for a few years now. The Standards themselves sound pretty good as you read them. These standards create higher expectations, more rigor, higher critical thinking skills, and several other pretty good things. However, after the Common Core Standards came, the assessment piece was introduced. This was called the PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) (pronounced 'park'). The ISAT and PSAE tests had been used for many years and everyone was comfortable with this exam. However, the ISAT test itself changed the last 3 years of implementation in an attempt to be more aligned to the new standards. In addition to the changing of the assessment piece, a whole new political philosophy about cutoff scores was introduced, as well as a new style and interpretation of what it meant to display understanding of a topic.

What is the political philosophy about cutoff scores?? Under the old testing system (ISAT & PSAE), about 50% of High School students were meeting the standards and about 80% of the students at the Grade School level were meeting the standards. These numbers had become accepted and many districts were satisfied with obtaining those numbers. However, Education is always a good topic for politicians and talking about how they will improve failing schools sparks the voter's interests. The percentages (50% & 80%) were too high to indicate any real problem with State education system. So, over the last 2 years of the ISAT, the State increased the proficiency cutoff score. They somewhat arbitrarily lower the percentage of students meeting the standards to below 60%. Then the new PARCC test came out last year and they chose cutoff scores so that only about 30% of students would meet the standards. Some argued that the new numbers were closer to being reflective of the percentage of students who advance to college and successfully complete a 4 year degree. Not to mention it is politically easier to advance an agenda of failing schools when only 30% of students are meeting standards vs. 80%.

What do I mean by a new style and interpretation of what it really means to display understanding of a topic?? The first thing we notice about the new style of the test is that it is mostly done online. There was a paper and pencil option for districts that did not have the computer capability to take the test. Schools taking pencil and paper saw about 10% higher scores than those who took it online, which indicates the online test was probably more challenging – another testing issue. The School Report Cards do not indicate which version a school took. Hartsburg-Emden took the online version. Anyway, the computer version had click and drags, matching, links to videos, and other computer based tasks. In addition students were being asked to explain their approach (or thought process) to solving a problem through writing, which isn't an easy task.

It is worth noting that early on in the Republican Presidential Primary; every candidate was asked if they supported the Common Core Standards. As with most issues, it is much more complicated than it looks on the surface because it is not just the standards. It is how we went about implementing, assessing, and politicizing those standards. This created a lot of anxiety (and strong emotions) over the change. Plus, they keep tweaking (changing) of the testing each year. We are going on 5 years where our students have not taken the same test. I can say with a lot of confidence, that in my 20 years as an educator, there has never been a period where so much change happens each year. This continues to add to the overall frustration of Common Core and PARCC. Every year I seem to enter into similar discussions about these items with friends, parents and fellow educators.

Many years ago, when I was in grade school, we took the Iowa Basic Skill test . . . then came the IGAP, ISAT, and now we have the PARCC. Illinois has a long history of testing students. Over this time, one could have always argued about the validity (or values) of these tests and there are some great points on both sides about State testing. I understand the frustration among educators that the assessment process has become so convoluted with politics. The target keeps changing and there has been a deliberate adjustment in the grading (cutoff scores), so only about 30% the students are considered passing. It has become hard to see the trees in the forest. All of a sudden the State came up with a quick & easy solution for people who were upset with the situation. If you don't like it, just "opt-out" (have the student just not take the test). This is an interesting approach on two fronts. One, the State requires that 90% of students to take it. Two, the message being sent to students is to refuse to do something if you don't like it. This is not the message many districts want to send our students.

I believe testing is here to stay. It is a piece of the puzzle. To me, it doesn't matter if it is the Iowa Basic Skill, IGAP, ISAT, or PARCC. It doesn't matter what the State decides to change the cutoff scores to. As educators, we need to look at the results, determine what they mean, and see how we can use them to improve instruction. This goes for all assessments or tests. I believe we always ask the students to do the best they can on everything they do, whether it is classwork, testing, athletics, extracurricular, family, religious beliefs, employment, etc. Education, hard-work, determination, and commitment go a long way to student success. Stags always do their best and never quit!! I believe the staff at Hartsburg-Emden will stay focused and will continue to do all the things that help our students be successful.

Physical exams are a STATE REQUIREMENT of all Kindergarten, 6<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> graders. Also, all Kindergarten, 6<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> graders are required to have their immunization records up to date. The Logan County

Health Department offers the booster immunizations and lead screenings. Please call them for an appointment at 735-2317.

The State of Illinois also requires that all children entering Kindergarten,  $2^{nd}$  and  $6^{th}$  grades to have a

dental examination. The examination must be completed between May 15, 2016 and May 15, 2017. Proof of examination is due no later than May 15, 2017.



All Kindergarten students and any student new to an Illinois school will be required to have a vision screening. The examination must be completed within the past 12 months. Proof of examination is due no later than October 15, 2016.

Students participating in sports and cheerleading must have a physical on file in the office before the tryouts or their sport's program begins. A sport's physical is good for one calendar year. Please remember that junior high softball starts in July and junior high baseball and high school golf and volleyball start at the beginning of August and the physicals need to be on file

**BEFORE** they may practice or tryout.
