FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

This time of year my focus is to get back into routine work with the focus on upholding the Schools' Mission Statement - "Hartsburg-Emden Community Unit School District provides an empowering and collaborative environment allowing students to reach their full potential." Excellence requires careful planning and analysis of the district as a whole, which includes more than just the fiscal oversight, which I have to admit, has become a good portion of my dealings. However, school culture and climate is a critical issue schools face. We need to expect that we treat everyone with dignity and respect. Students need to learn more than the 3 R's (Reading, Riting, and Rithmetic, as the old saying goes). Another important R that students really need to learn about is Relationships. There aren't any courses on relationships, but children need to learn how to treat each other properly; it is critical. Like any other learning, students make mistakes in this area and we need to correct them and let them know the proper way it should be done. October has been established as Bullying Prevention Month. Each year, our staff takes training on identifying, addressing, and reporting bullying. The State has mandated this training and has provided information about bullying. Bullying is an issue that schools have been taking very seriously for many years. Hartsburg-Emden will continue to combat all issues involving bullying. We will continue to address all inappropriate behavior when it is brought forward.

All students have the right to attend a school where individual differences are respected and to learn in a safe, secure and supportive environment that is free of bullying. Three key criteria that distinguish what bullying is:

- o It is intentionally hurtful and/or aggressive behavior
- o It is a pattern of behavior that is repetitive
- § It may happen regularly and over some period of time
- o It involves a perceived imbalance of power or strength
- § The person being bullied feels they have less power or strength

Two Types of Bullying:

<u>Direct Bullying</u> may be physical [examples include: hitting, kicking, shoving, spitting, choking] and/or verbal [examples include: name calling, threatening, taunting, malicious teasing]

<u>Indirect Bullying</u> is more subtle and less easy to detect [examples include: intentional social isolation, exclusion, lies, false rumors, and/or reputation slandering]

There is an increasing number of individuals who are using technology to tease, intimidate, threaten, and/or otherwise cause harm to a student, group of students, and/or school personnel [examples include: email messages, instant messages, text messages, digital pictures or images, and Facebook postings].

Such acts constitute bullying regardless of whether they are committed on or off school district property.

 Bullying that happens off school grounds usually has ramifications in some form at school

Bullying interferes directly with a student's ability to learn. Students who are bullied may find it difficult to concentrate and sometimes experience a decline in grades and a diminished sense of confidence/self-esteem.

The responsibility of preventing bullying rests on the entire school community including parents, administrators, teachers, staff, and students.

- Everyone is responsible for helping prevent bullying
- § The biggest thing everyone can do is to report it when they observe it happening
- o Parents play a crucial role in helping with bullying prevention
- § If your child is being bullied, or if you are aware of others who are the targets of such behavior, please report this information immediately to your child's teacher or an administrator
- § We appreciate your support in addressing this important issue

The district's goals with bullying are:

o Prevent all bullying and to take action to

- investigate, respond to, remediate, and when appropriate, discipline acts of bullying
- § Address issues as soon as possible and correct any misbehavior as soon as possible
- o Pursue a safe environment where all students respect each other
- § Continually encourage our students to treat each other with dignity and respect
- § Have our students follow the golden rule: treat others as you wish to be treated
- § Encourage our students to not tolerate and report all bullying

There are times I listen to the news and wonder when our ability to treat others with dignity and respect began to decline. Acts of kindness (which we continue to encourage) can boost feelings of confidence, being in control, happiness and optimism. They may also encourage others to repeat the good deeds. They contribute to a more positive community and school. I also encourage the staff to establish and maintain positive relationships with our students, so we have a positive school culture where every child has an empowering environment to reach their full potential with confidence. Following the golden rule, treat other as you wish to be treated, is a reminder we repeat often. I would like to thank St John's Lutheran Church (Hartsburg) for the very generous donation of \$10,000 for a new clock system at the Jr./Sr. High School. The very outdated system was no longer repairable and we updated to a wireless system. This donation covered about 90% of the costs for the new system. We appreciate the support we receive from our church community.

On a final note: I love the fall season. The changing of the color of the trees and cooler days provide such a great opportunity to be outside to enjoy some of nature's wonders. I hope you all find the time to enjoy it; it seems like such a short season.
