At the beginning of each school year, I talk with our staff about the importance of relationships. In *Fourth R in Education*, Miriam M. Witmer (2005), discusses the significance of the teacher-student relationship and the importance of the role the teacher plays in the development of that relationship. I continue to request that the staff of Hartsburg-Emden CUSD #21 Schools be committed to creating and maintaining positive, mutually beneficial relationships with our students, families, staff, and community. I have faith in the fact that relationships with other people will bring one the greatest joy in their lives. A life filled with positive relationships with others will be a life well lived. A school that has positive relationships within its walls will have the foundation for success. I do believe that our staff continues to work to develop professional and positive relationships with our students, parents, and community ensuring that we are able to support the needs of our children (and their families). Having positive relationships are important because they help children develop independence, self-esteem, and well-being. Children want and need positive, loving/caring relationships with the people closest to them. Students learn better from teachers who they feel have their best interest at heart. As you may expect, the opposite is also true. When students have positive relationships and have high expectations that are shown to them, they are more capable of meeting those expectations and being successful.

I am also a firm believer that every student should have effective skills of critical thinking and problem-solving. The critical thinking skill seems to be more important today than when I was a child. The internet (AI – Artificial Intelligence) and social media has allowed a lot of material to be made public immediately and to travel around quickly. Being able to analyze who said it, why did they say it, is it true; is important to the critical thinking component. The old saying about telling a lie convincingly, repeating it often, and people will come to believe it; has much validity. We should not take anything for granted when thinking critically about the information we have received and look for a multitude of sources with the same level of analysis. The problem-solving component is often associated with critical thinking. In a problem-solving situation, a student attempts to find a solution. The student needs to form a method of attacking a problem

that he/she may not exactly know how to solve but still moves forward with a strategy to find a solution. One of the important elements of problem solving skills that students should have is to choose an appropriate strategy in finding a solution of the problems, which is important in terms of achieving success in solving the issue before them. Students with effective skills of critical thinking and problem-solving will enter adulthood as independent thinkers ready to meet all the challenges of life.

On a personal note, another semester as the Superintendent of the Hartsburg-Emden School District is coming to a close and it continues to be an honor to serve in this capacity. I thank everyone (students, parents, board members, and staff) for the relationships I've developed with you over the past twelve and a half (12.5) years. All-in-all, I truly have enjoyed our students, the schools, and the community. Being an educator, is where my passion has always lied. I value the continual growth mindset that education provides. I am looking forward to the next phase as I move to interim status and begin my new position in O'Fallon. I will be in Hartem on most Monday's and Friday's second semester and in O'Fallon during the middle of the week. I am looking forward to next semester. ## **JUNIORS AND SENIORS**

This would be a great time for seniors to finish college applications and scholarships. The earlier a college receives an application, the more favorably it is generally viewed. Most colleges also practice what is known as “Rolling Admissions,” meaning that they process applications as they are received, so those applying early often find out much sooner about their admissions status. This can be a big advantage later when having to make a final decision about where you will attend in the fall. The bottom line – it pays to apply to colleges early.

Winter break is a perfect time for juniors to be practicing for the SAT, researching colleges, careers, and setting goals for after high school. I suggest that students use their winter break very wisely! Mark your calendars for **April 9, 2024**, a rep from ISAC will be here to help the juniors get a jump start on college applications. ## 24-25 DUAL CREDIT COURSES

It's time to start thinking about courses for the 24-25 school year. Are you interested in taking college classes while still in high school? Dual credit is an opportunity for students in grades 11-12 to receive extra high school credit AND earn college credit towards Gen. Eds. HEHS will be offering the following dual credit courses next year: **LIT 111: Introduction to Literature**, **HUMA 101: Introduction to Humanities** and **BUSN 110: Introduction to Business**.

### **Qualifications:**

If you are interested in taking a Dual Credit course next year (AY 24-25), you **MUST** complete a Heartland application by **February 29, 2024**, and ACCUPLACER Assessment (or submit a qualifying score) by **March 29, 2024** in order to be eligible to enroll in the course. Students can submit qualifying ACT or PSAT/SAT scores in place of the ACCUPLACER. [Please note: There is a \$200 registration fee for each dual credit class. See Mrs. Hilgert for details.
