FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

As many of you are aware, I strongly believe in continual growth/improvement. I talk about it often because it is at the core of my beliefs. It is my belief that perfection is something we strive to get closer to each day, week, month, and year. By the end of this school year, I am hopeful we'll have moved closer to excellence. I am also hopeful we will have moved our student's mindsets closer to that of continual growth/improvement. We all need to continue to work to be the best version of ourselves as possible. Too many people fall short of their full potential because they mistakenly fall into a fixed mindset (and that can be often difficult to change). Those with a fixed mindset limit themselves because they feel their potential is limited. Those with a continual growth mindset are always growing/improving throughout their lifetime. At Hartsburg-Emden we believe all our students have the ability to reach their goals and we want to do our best to ensure that happens.

One of the most important steps someone can take toward achieving their goals in life is to learn to monitor their mindset and its impact on performance, relationships and everyone around them. Why is having awareness about one's mindset so important? Teachers often say to students "attitude is everything". Attitude shows one's mindset, it governs the way students perceive the world and the way the world perceives them. Students who realize their mindset (or attitude) choose to respond to challenges or failure in a positive way. People with the fixed mindset look at failure as a quitting point, assuming they've reached their potential, which is often not the case. As educators, we need to challenge students and help guide them through failure. To me, there is nothing more frustrating than to see students 'give up' when faced with a challenge or failure. It truly is such a waste of (what I know to be) their abilities and potential. But as I said before, it is often difficult to convince them of that. So, we'll always do our best to keep pushing them.

Michael Jordan is widely considered to be the greatest basketball player of all time. In fact, he's arguably one of the greatest athletes of all time. He was a four-time gold medalist with USA Basketball, including winning two Olympic Gold Medals, and was twice named the USA Basketball Male Athlete of the Year.

For more than a decade, he was the face of the NBA. Michael Jordan is a great example for success coming to someone after much invested time and effort ('hard work') and after experiencing failure. Michael Jordan often encourages young individuals by telling them to never fear failure, fear not trying, fear not giving your best, fear losing focus, but never fear failure itself. Failure is the path to success. Failure is the sign that you're headed in the right direction. To succeed twice as fast, work twice as hard, and maybe fail twice as much. Michael Jordan said, "I've never been afraid to fail." Failure means you haven't succeeded . . . yet!

Over my 28 years in the profession, I've seen a lot of different things happen to public education; the new Common Core standards, PERA (*Performance Evaluation Reform Act – new teacher evaluation tool*), *multiple initiatives* to close the achievement gap for minorities and special needs students, continual funding issues, the latest curriculum initiative (often passed down from legislatures – not educators), and many more items. Hartsburg-Emden school district has addressed these important factors and we'll continue to address them. However, I believe establishing students with a continual growth mindset and the ability to view failure as an opportunity (through hard work, grit, and a positive attitude) to achieve their goals – will always put students on the path to success. Work Hard/Play Hard hasn't been just an important message that I've tried to send to our students, it is something I've tried pushing onto the faculty at Hartem as well. We need to remind ourselves of that each day. We are here to help each child reach their fullest potential. Grit, determination, positive attitude, meeting challenges, learning from failures, are all part of the continual growth mindset. Having the belief that you are on a continuous journey of growth and development will move you closer to success and help avoid a fixed mindset.

In conclusion, Spring begins on March 19th. I look forward to some nice days and being outside again. Until next month . . . Go Stags!!

GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT

Time is flying and it is hard to believe we will be entering the last quarter of the school year this month. Scheduling for the upcoming year will be happening in the very near future. It is time to start thinking about what classes you are interested in for the 2024- 2025 school year.

There will be a Freshman Orientation held on Thursday, April 18th at 6:00 pm in the high school computer lab. Current 8th grade students and a parent are strongly encouraged to attend this meeting. Students will have an opportunity to choose their 2024-2025 classes during this meeting. We will also cover an overview of required courses for graduation, grading scales, and highlights of elective offerings.

March also marks the start of testing season for schools. Testing for the Illinois Assessment of Readiness will begin in March. Students in 3rd – 8th grade will be participating in IAR testing. Grades 3-5th will begin the IAR the week of March 4th and grades 6th-8th will begin the week of March 11th. Additionally, students in 5th grade, 8th grade, and 11th grade will take the Illinois Science Assessment. The juniors will take the ISA (Illinois Science Assessment) on April 9th and the 5th and 8th graders will take it on April 11th. Students in 11th grade will also be required to take the SAT on April 10th. Please keep an eye out for more information about the test day. Illinois has mandated that all students in 9th and 10th grade take the PSAT. Freshman will take the PSAT 8/9 on April 18th and sophomores will take the PSAT 10 on April 17th. Students can prepare for the PSAT and/or SAT by accessing practice materials at <https://www.collegeboard.org/> or <https://www.khanacademy.org/sat>. If you have any questions about any of the mandatory standardized tests, please don't hesitate to reach out

Testing for the State tests is important for your student's success. Because of this, testing can be very stressful. Here are some ways you can help minimize stress and maximize their performance throughout the testing process:

- DO make sure your child completes homework assignments and class projects. Because tests reflect overall achievement, the more effort your child puts into learning, the more likely he/she will do well on tests.
- DO make sure your child gets a good night's sleep, eats a healthy breakfast, and gets to school on time on the morning of the test.
- DO encourage your child to think positive thoughts about their performance on the test. For example, "I am going to ace this test!"
- DO support your child. Praise him/her for what he/she does well. When students feel good about themselves, they will do their best.

24-25 DUAL-CREDIT COURSES

Are you interested in taking college classes while still in high school? Dual credit is an opportunity for students in grades 11th – 12th to take classes in high school and one or more college level classes on an online university. Dual credit courses are a great opportunity to receive extra high school credit AND earn college credit towards Gen. Eds. The courses that will be offered next year are: **LIT 111: Introduction to Literature**, **HUM 101: Introduction to Humanities** and **BUS 110: Introduction to Business**.

Qualifications:

If you are interested in taking a Dual Credit course next year (AY 24-25), you **MUST** complete a Heartland application by **March 23rd** and ACCUPLACER Assessment (or submit a qualifying score) by **April 26th** in order to be eligible to enroll in the course. Students can submit qualifying ACT or PSAT/SAT scores in place of the ACCUPLACER. See Mrs. Hilgert for details. Please note: There is a \$200 registration fee for each dual credit class.
