FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

We have almost completed the first quarter of the school year already! The official end to the first quarter of school will be Friday, October 18th. I appreciate all the support given to our school district and teachers by the parents and community.

Wednesday, October 9th and Thursday, 10th will be parent-teacher conferences. I hope parents are able to attend to have some great conversations with teachers about their child's academic progress. If you are unable to attend the conferences, please contact your child's teacher to set up a meeting to discuss how your child is doing in school. We strive to develop positive home-school relationships with our families. If you have a concern or question, please call or email your child's teachers and/or the District Office so we can answer your questions or concerns.

How important is attendance?? Statistics show that students with persistent absences are less likely to achieve their full potential, and often affect grades, and a child's future prospects. Elementary Students with no absence are 4.7 times more likely to achieve the State Standards than persistent absentee students (defines as 15% or more absences in a school year). At Junior High/High School Levels, students with no absence are 2.8 times more likely to achieve State Standards in both English and Math than students missing 15% or more according to the Hatfield Academy. In another study, of 9th grade students with persistent absenteeism, the percentage of those 9th grade students who graduated on time, decreased by more than 50%. There are many more studies which indicate similar findings. We understand there are times that you may need to take your child out of school for various things. We ask that you please call the Jr./Sr. High School Office at 217-642-5244 or the Grade School Office at 217-376-3151 when you know your child is going to be absent or tardy. Our offices have answering machines, so you may leave a message at any time. Punctuality is also important. Arriving late to school may not only affect your child, but every other child in the classroom, as your child walks in late. If a student comes to school 10 minutes late every day, that comes out to 33 hours of lost learning each year.

The month of October is National Bullying Prevention Month and at Hartsburg-Emden School District, we take this issue very seriously. Sadly, continued reports of bullying and the abuse of children and young people, as well as vulnerable adults, within our nation, state, communities, and schools are constant reminders of the need to continually safeguard individuals and recommit ourselves to ensuring a safe environment for all. This topic needs constant monitoring. Plus, bullies know when they are being watched and often wait for opportunities when they know they aren't being watched. Hartsburg-Emden School District stand firm in this effort through our policies and practices to prevent bullying. We stand as a force for good and remain committed to zero tolerance of bullying (mental, physical, or of any any-kind). Our goal is to ensure that every student is respected and feels safe from harm. If you ever have any issue or concern in regards to bullying, please feel free to contact the school, so we can address it. Please don't assume we already know it is happening or that someone else will inform us.

In conclusion, I'd like to say that we have many exciting activities going on in our buildings. We continually work on developing positive relationships with our students. We stress to our students the concepts of continual growth and maintaining a culture of learning. I enjoy getting into the classrooms and attending school events in the evening to watch our students grow and develop. I encourage each of you (our community) to take full advantage of what we have to offer. As always, I appreciate the support you give our district, staff, and especially our students. It is the positive and ongoing partnership that makes Hartsburg-Emden a great place to be a Stag! The world could use a little bit more of that.

Progress Reports were sent home on Sept. 18th. This is a great opportunity to review your child's progress towards semester grades.

If your child needs academic support:

- Discuss the course with your child. What challenges are they facing?
- Are they using their planner? HEHS provided every student a free planner the first day of school.
- Make sure you have Tyler Gradebook access. Check this often to help your child stay up-to-date with his/her course and remind them to turn in any missing assignments.
- Contact the teacher to get more information about the course expectations and outline- some teachers use a website to communicate information
- Students should attend before/after school help sessions with teachers, if possible

College Applications

- Seniors – Make sure you get started on those college applications! With the earlier FAFSA date, many universities are looking at earlier application deadlines. Be sure to check with each school to determine important deadlines.

Speaking of the FAFSA...

- The FAFSA opened for 2020-2021 applications on October 1st, 2019. All seniors should submit their applications as soon as possible in order for the best opportunity for federal assistance. Many schools are asking students to have their FAFSA applications submitted by a priority deadline of November 15th. Many university scholarships may also fall under this date.
- Hartsburg-Emden High School will be hosting a **FAFSA Completion Workshop** on **Wednesday, October 2nd, 2019**. All seniors and their parents are strongly encouraged to attend. The Executive Director of the Logan County Education Coalition will be providing a brief presentation about the FAFSA and will be available to provide hands-on assistance in completing the FAFSA application on-site. This workshop will take place in the HS computer lab from

5:30 – 6:30 pm. Please RSVP with Mrs. Feltes (afeltes@hartem.org) for a list of important items to bring with to the workshop. If you cannot attend this workshop but would still like to attend a completion workshop, visit isac.org and search "Outreach Activities Calendar" for a list of upcoming workshops across Illinois. Workshops are also available on Wednesdays in October at 3:30 pm at the Heartland Community College campus in Normal.

Welcome to a new **CATCH** school year!! I am happy to announce that the Junior High will now be participating in the **CATCH** program under the leadership of Mrs. Curry.

According to CATCH.org: ***CATCH stands for a Coordinated Approach to Child Health. By uniting multiple players in a child's life to create a community of health, CATCH is proven to prevent childhood obesity and supported by 25 years and 120 academic papers indicating as much as 11% decrease in overweight and obesity. Our community health programs aim to impact the messaging a child receives in physical education, the lunchroom, the classroom, and at home, to influence a child's choices not only in school, but lifelong. Two of the most important ways that CATCH creates behavior change are by enabling children to identify healthy foods, and by increasing the amount of moderate to vigorous physical activity (MVPA) children engage in each day. Our health education curriculum uses terminology for identifying healthful foods—GO, SLOW and WHOA—that has been adopted colloquially nationwide as a simple means of labeling food's nutritional content.***

CATCH kick-off will be the week of September 30th-October 4th. Students at the Grade School will be having taste tests, art projects, special guests and much more.
